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


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






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### PEACE THAT PASSES ALL UNDERSTANDING



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
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


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# FORGIVING GRACE

#### Throne of grace:

Heb. 4:16 commands the believer to draw close to the throne of grace! "Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need (Heb. 4:16). In the Old Testament, we see the throne of Solomon, which is a type of the throne of Grace in the New Testament.

1 Kings 10:18-20. He made a great throne of ivory and overlaid it with the best gold. The throne had six steps and the top of the throne was round behind. And there were stays on either side on the place of the seat, and two lions stood beside the stays. And twelve lions stood there on the one side and on the other upon the six steps: there was not the like made in any kingdom".

There was no other throne like the throne of King Solomon in all of the earth! It was made of ivory which is white and strong, harder than rock, uniform without any blemish. It represented solid consistent purity in life. It is overlaid with the best gold. Gold stands for grace in the bible. But what is the "best gold"? It is grace upon grace.

We also see the lions on either side, and the word of God describes two of the outstanding characteristics of lion, Prov 28:1, "Righteous are bold like lion". Prov. 30:30, "Lion the strongest among beasts which turns not away for any". There is boldness and strength with holiness and purity.

The throne of grace of our Lord Jesus Christ is the source of power for the saint. It can transform any one. It makes the most fearful one bold enough to die for Him. It can make him strong enough to forgive even enemies.

Timothy was a timid fearful young man afraid to use his gifts (1 Timothy 4:14), 2 Timothy 1:6-7, 1 Cor. 16:10. In 2 Timothy 2:1 Paul commands Timothy, "You therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus". Heb. 13:23, Take notice that our brother Timothy has been released, with whom, if he comes soon, I will see you. The timid fearfulbecame bold enough to go to prison for Jesus.

#### Chasm fixed:

If an unbeliever refuses to strive to enter through the Gate of Grace and achieve the forgiveness,a serious consequence awaits him. Luke 16:19-31 is the story of Lazarus and the rich man. Verse 26 "And besides all this, between us and you there is a great chasm fixed, so that those who wish to come over from here to you will not be able, and that none may cross over from there to us". In short Abraham father says, there is a gulf that is fixed now. The gulf the rich man maintained while he was on earth, with God and with God's people and with Lazarus. The only difference is that it got fixed now.


Due to the lack of forgiving grace, there could be somechasm that exists between us and God'speople, our own brothers and sisters.One must bear in mind that the gulf gets fixed beyond this life.Now is the time to bridge the gulf, to close the gap while on earth.

#### Bridging or Wedging:

The spiritual application to a believer is that, only we know in our heart what gulf or gulfs are maintained and with whom. Here on earth the gulf is not fixed, can be bridged. It might sound like play of words, but we are good at "wedging the gap" instead of "bridging the gap". The wedge is convenient to be put in to close the gap and removed at will. That is hypocrisy and God does not approve it.

Another thing in Verse 25, But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your life you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus bad things; but now he is being comforted here, and you are in agony".Now nothing could be done. The rich man was asking for just a drop of water since his tongue was being tormented. But unfortunately, not even a small drop of blessing could come, because of the gulf that got fixed.

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# UNITY : SO WHAT IS THE BIG IDEA?

**KEY CONCEPT:** An effective sermon will have one BIG idea that holds the entire sermon together. The BIG idea of the sermon should always come from the biblical text. The BIG idea is a clear simple sentence that expresses what the sermon is about.

# RULE 2 - The BIG idea of a sermon is one or two sentences that clearly express what the sermon is about.

J.H. Jowett says:

"I have a conviction that no sermon is ready for preaching, not ready for writing out, until we can express its theme in a short, pregnant sentence as clear as crystal. I find the getting of that sentence is the hardest, the most exacting, and the most fruitful labour in my study... I do not think any sermon ought to be preached or even written, until that sentence has emerged, clear and lucid as a cloudless moon."15

Bryan Chappell says the BIG idea of a sermon should be simple enough to pass the "3:00 A.M. test."16 He says to imagine someone from your church wakes you up at 3:00 A.M. and asks the simple question: What is the sermon about? If you can't give a quick and clear answer, then the sermon is probably not ready to be preached.

Note that having a BIG idea is good communication practice. Chris Anderson says about TED talks:

"A good exercise is to try to encapsulate your throughline in no more than fifteen words. And those fifteen words need to provide robust content. It's not enough to think of your goal as, "I want to inspire the audience" or "I want to win support for my work." It has to be more focused than that. What is the precise idea you want to build inside your listeners? What is their takeaway?"17

Look at the two examples below. Which one is a helpful BIG idea sentence? Which one will help the preacher in his preparation? Which one will help the listener of the sermon?

#### Example 1

When the sinful nation of Israel went into exile, it messianic hope and vision were mistakenly and faithlessly diminished because pre-Ezran and preNehemiahic proofs of God's sovereign plan, purpose, and intentions for his people were obscured in Babylonian circumstances of incarceration and oppression that would not be relieved until the Persian emancipation and further covenantal revelations in advancing redemptive history.

#### Example 2

God remains faithful to faithless people.

#### SUMMARY

An effective sermon will have one BIG idea that holds the entire sermon together.

Two basic rules for the BIG idea:

RULE 1 – The BIG idea of the sermon should come from the biblical text

RULE 2 - The BIG idea of a sermon is one or two sentences that clearly express what the sermon is about



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# TIME MANAGEMENT

n the previous column I have discussed the importance of time management andoffered some practical advises. In this article I shall suggest some more helpful strategies.

**PLANNING:** Lack of planning is a key problem in time management. Planning ahead is a great time saver. It is said that every minute one plans for a day saves 3 minutes when completing a task. In addition to mentally planning activities for a day or week, it is good to put those plans in writing. Make a written schedule helps to keep the focus. There are different kinds of planning that include day planning, weekly planning, and month Planning.

**SETTING GOALS:** To handle time efficiently it is important that the goals set are realistic, achievable, specific, and concrete.

**DEALING WITH PROCRASTINATION:** We postponed things that are unpleasant, things that are difficult, and things that involve tough decisions. It becomes a habit and a psychological problem for some. It is said that procrastination breeds procrastination. There are two solutions to procrastination: Procrastination is a subconscious message that one's priorities are out of focus, and therefore clarifying one's objectives and priorities is the first step to right direction. Developing the habit of planning each day is another step is to take. Developing a do-now habit is a good skill to learn. **"Never put off till tomorrow what you can do today."** 

**FLEXIBILITY:** Life is not always predictable, and as a result having a mindset of flexibility is useful to get works done. Avoid rigidity and don't be dictated by

a time table. The principle is to be sufficiently organized to have a "buffer zone, so that you can give the time needed without over-stretching yourself.

#### **GETTING ORGANIZED AND STAYING ORGANIZED:**

Using lists, color coding files, and keeping journals are constructive ways to organize tasks. Make use of such organizational tools as palm handheld organizers, personal organizers, wall calendars, address books, sticky notes, and schedule management software.

**DEVELOPING A DO LIST:** Make a list of everything you need to do (a do list) day by day, and hr. by hr. Prioritize the list based on deadline; things to do today, tomorrow, this week, and everything else. Marking the jobs/tasks completed is a way to monitor the progress.

**<u>TIMING ON EACH TASK</u>**: It is said that "Some things are worth doing well; some things are worth doing very well; and some things are just worth doing." Working out how much time one needs to spend on each task, and allocating time, accordingly, is a skilled way to manage time.

**EVALUATING YOUR TIME:** Asking such important questions as "Is time wasted?"; "Is time unbalanced?"; "Is time spent profitably?"; "Is time used creatively?" are the right questions to raise.

I hope, the readers will pay attention to these valuable ideas and put them into practice to improve your time management skills. We will continue this theme in future columns as well.

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# What Is Christian Moderation?

oderation is temperance or selfcontrol. The dictionary defines moderationas "avoiding extremes.""Moderate" is defined as "kept within reasonable limits." Philippians 4:5 says, "Let your moderation [gentleness] be known to all men. The Lord is at hand." Too much of almost anything is not good. "And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things....I discipline my body and bring it into subjection..." These verses are found in 1 Corinthians 9, where Paul discusses the Christian race and striving for the imperishable He is temperate and has selfcrown. control.Christians should use moderation in all things to follow what the Bible teaches and to keep a pure testimony.

One example of the lack of moderation is when a person becomes drunk from too much wine. The sin is drunkenness. Ephesians 5:18 says, "And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit." Dissipation means "excess" or "over indulgence in pleasure." Proverbs 23:21 tells us that "the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty." Overeating - or gluttony - is as wrong as drunkenness. Obviously, one has to eat, but without temperance in how much he eats, he will become a glutton. Don't live to eat; eat to live. "For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that *they* are the enemies of the cross of Christ: whose end is their destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is their shame – who set their mind on earthly things" (Philippians 3:18-19, emphasis added). Proverbs 25:16 speaks about moderation: "Have you found honey? Eat only as much as you need, lest you be filled with it and vomit." That verse can apply to everything we do, not just to eating.

### **Smoking and Gambling**

Are smoking and gambling sins? The Bible does not specifically command not to do these things,

but that doesn't mean that those things are good to do. While the Scripture doesn't address such topics, it does provide principles to guide us on these issues. Both, like drinking, can become addictive. These thingsdo not help us in our Christian walk. Paul says in 1 Cor. 6:12, "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." If it is not a help, why do it? Paul is saying he will not allow himself to become addicted to something unhelpful. Furthermore, gambling becomes a way to "get rich quick" without working, which destroys work ethics. But more often, gambling leads to the loss of money. With determination and training, we can become productive members of society and useful members of the Church.

#### Idols in our Life

Some Christians can have idols, perhaps not of stone which they bow down to, but things which they count as more important than God. Idols for some may be the sport they play, making money, being in fashion, being good-looking, or a person they love or admire. These things become idols when they are to them the "most important things in life" that keep them from serving God. Hebrews 12:1 tells us to "...lay aside every weight, and the sin which easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." Most agree that we must put off sin. But then there are the extra things in life that take our mind off of the things of the Lord: we must decide what we can rid ourselves of to become more Christlike.Jesus kept Himself free of things that could weigh Him down and pull Him away from God's plan. Often we complain of the busyness of life, but we could solve that problem by laying aside the weights. Then we will run the Christian race with new energy, and see God's will more clearly.

"To the churches of the United States: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I am writing to remind you that you are one body through Christ and are united through the Spirit. In saying this, you need to get over yourselves and talk to each other face-to-face (not on Facebook) about politics."

If Paul were to write a letter to the church today, I think it might read like that.

The church is divided, though few of us talk about it. We shove it under the pew, listen to the sermon and move on. We ignore a major stumbling block that we need to address.

It's not easy to be a Christian in this intense political atmosphere — especially when you know that your political views may be polar opposite from your brothers and sisters in Christ. Disagreements are inevitable, but they shouldn't keep us from being transparent with one another and having the relationship that God intended for members of the church to have.

While it is easy to say that we, as Christians, put our faith in God before our allegiance to America, the political debates in which we engage — and our social media accounts — suggest otherwise. The phrase "conservative Christian" itself puts political ideology before religious identity. This is unfortunate, as Christians could be spending their time combating the intense climate of this political season rather than adding to it.

There are so many other things that should capture our attention and prayers right now. Christians suffer in the Middle East. ISIS and other terrorist groups commit atrocities. Here at home there's racial tension. Children are separated from their parents. Drug addiction destroys lives. Souls are lost.

Yet we bicker about a politician's email or a real estate mogul's tax returns. Or we complain that neither is addressing the real issues. 'While I admire people of faith who proclaim the truth about God's Word on Sundays, I am disappointed when I see them post hateful things on social media.'We are the issue. Our obsession with things that don't matter has taken our minds away from God's call to seek and save the lost. The demeaning rhetoric used by many Christians about other souls — including political candidates, protesters and those practicing different religions — drives people away from us.

In <u>Matthew 15:8-11</u> Jesus says, "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me...What goes into someone's mouth does not defile them, but what comes out of their mouth, that is what defiles them."

While I admire people of faith who proclaim the truth about God's Word on Sundays, I am disappointed when I see them post hateful things on social media.

Do we apply God's commands equally when we take stances on the issues that divide us politically? We oppose abortion because of the sanctity of human life while we rail against any attempts to limit our access to firearms. What about the lives of victims of gun violence? We preach about love and unity, but have we tied our faith to a particular political stance?

In John 16:12-14, Jesus tells us, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."

We need to talk with one another — and talk to those with whom we disagree — to find understanding.

This should not be an "I'm right, you're wrong" kind of conversation. If we listen and understand, this dialogue has the power to mend churches and make us into the family that God envisions. 'We need to talk with one another — and talk to those with whom we disagree — to find understanding. 'Soon, all of the sound bites, advertisements and endless chatter of this political season will vanish.

Let's not live for the things that will pass, but for the body that will last for an eternity.

# HYMAN APPELMAN

**Evangelist Preacher** 



#### Hyman Jedidiah Appelman (1902-1983)

He was born in Russia to orthodox Jewish parents who moved to America in 1914. Appelman became a trial lawyer in Chicago. At age twenty-eight he was converted to Christianity, causing his parents to disown him. His father said to him, "When your sides come together from hunger and you come crawling to my door, I will throw you a crust of bread as I would any other *dog.*" Feeling a definite call to preach, he attended Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and became one of the greatest evangelists of his generation. Dr. Appelman made eight or nine trips around the world and several trips to Russia as an evangelist. It was hard to find a day in his long ministry of fiftythree years that he was not preaching somewhere. He was the author of some forty books.



# **TALKING TRUTH** HOW TO PREPARE & PRESENT GOSPEL TALKS

You will have quite enough material from the text and background information for a good sermon. You will also have the basis of an outline. You could take three or four of these questions, and make them your main headings. You might even leave them in question form, and make your answer to each the material for the sermon, thus:

- 1. What was Paul trying to prove?
- 2. How did Abraham show he believed God?

3. Why was it reckoned to him for righteousness?

4. How does this prove Paul's point?

Later we shall talk about introductions and conclusions and subheadings, but at present we are concerned in getting at the chief ideas, which provide the main headings of the sermon.

Dr. James Black, in "The Mystery of Preaching," emphasizes the same idea. "When I have my text or subject, I put a series of questions to it, and try to answer them. With something like this: What does it mean? What did it mean for that man in his own day? Why was he led to say this? ... And is it true always? Does it mean the same for me today? What would it mean for me if I accepted what the text teaches? What principles or duties does it involve for me? ...

What must I do to make this message real and true in my own life? How can I illustrate in modern terms what the text teaches for myself and others?"

You will notice that Dr. Black's questions ask for the meaning of the words when they were written, and the truth of them, but particularly concerning their meaning and truth for us, today. That is how a great preacher applies Scripture teaching to life.

We must all learn to do that, more or less. It would repay you richly as a preacher if you memorized those questions from Dr. Black, as you would learn a poem. If you can ask questions of a text in that way, and can answer them at all intelligently, you could hardly fail to be an interesting preacher. It means work, of course--hard work. To be a worth-while preacher you must be prepared to work.

#### EXAMPLE #1

Sometimes there is a lack of imagination, but there is often a suspicion that there has been a lack of sufficiently hard work. Cultivate the habit of asking many questions, so that when you have answered them you have sufficient material for a sermon.

Let us take an example. **Heb. 11:24-26:** "By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to be evil entreated with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; accounting the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt: for he looked unto the recompense of reward."

Now for your questions. It would pay you to pause here and ask your own questions and compare them with what follows.

What are the historical facts behind this text? (You must read Exodus to get them.)

What were the circumstances when Moses came of age that made a choice necessary?

What choices did he make?

What afflictions did he suffer because of his choice?

What does the reproach of Christ mean?

What did he renounce?

What was involved in being the son of Pharaoh's daughter?

What pleasures of sin were meant in Moses' case? Is sin pleasurable?

What treasures of Egypt would have been his had he done the other thing?

What enabled him to make such a great renunciation and such a choice?

What is faith?

How does it act to make such choices possible?

Is my faith strong enough to make me do something worthwhile?

Will my faith stand in a crisis?


Is there any great renunciation I should make?

Are there any great choices, fraught with big consequences, that I should make?

You see there are many questions you may ask a text. Some of them, and the answers, may be useless for your purpose. But out of them all, when by diligence and hard work, you have answered them, you will have abundance of material for a sermon.

We have not studied introductions and conclusions yet, but you would not find it difficult to provide them here. Your answers may suggest an outline like this:

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# Now, Christian Prayer Meet Called Off in Bengaluru Over 'Conversion' Allegations

A Christian prayer meeting was cancelled in the country's IT capital Bengaluru on Saturday after complaints were lodged that this could facilitate forced conversions in the city which was to host two American preachers for this event.



Bengaluru: A Christian prayer meeting was cancelled in the country's IT capital Bengaluru on Saturday after complaints were lodged that this could facilitate forced conversions in the city which was to host two American preachers for this event.

The cancellation came just about 12 hours before the prayer meeting was to be held. Nearly 1,000 people were expected to attend the meetings spread over Saturday and Sunday. It was cancelled in the wake of protests lodged by Hindutva groups like the Bajrang Dal.

A similar prayer meeting was cancelled in Maharajganj district of Uttar Pradesh, after the Hindu YuvaVahini, founded by UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, alleged forced conversions (allegations that were later proven wrong) in the meeting that saw barely 150 people participating.

In Bengaluru, the first complaint was filed on Friday afternoon by one Girish Bhardwaj, who wrote to the Foreigners' Regional Registration Office — a police wing that tracks foreigners visiting Karnataka that two American evangelists were in India for "religious conversion", in violation of their visa norms.

"The two foreigners had applied for Indian visa only to attend religious campaigns. Clearly, they are misleading the Indian Consulate," he alleged.

Later on Friday, Bajrang Dal convenor Keshav Nayak filed a police complaint that this programme was "aimed at converting innocent Hindus....lit was being held daringly in public, where cash would be offered to the converts. As such, it hurts the religious sentiments of the Hindus." He asked that the organisers be arrested and suitable legal action be taken.

That the programme was hastily cancelled was evident when News18 spoke to one of the organisers. "We have always held retreats and services at this church. This event, too, was only for our church parishioners. We don't know why questions are being raised about permission. We are not converting anyone, only Christians are attendingthis," said a puzzled prayer coordinator.

Interestingly, the programme actually charged participants Rs 100 if they wanted to attend it — and the posters did not make any claims of giving anyone money or gifts.

Police officials did not want to be drawn into the controversy but merely said they did not ask anyone to cancel any event. "If there are allegations of visa violation, we will verify. But if there are no non-Christians attending it, where is the issue of conversion? That too an event inside the premises of their own auditorium of a local church," said a senior police officer.


The programme — themed Power and Reality of the Kingdom — was to be held in a church in east Bengaluru. Comments on social media by the two preachers who posted pictures of their visit to a place in interior Maharashtra — where over 8,000 people are said to have attended — were objected to by Hindutva activists.

#### Fani Juggernaut Leaves 32 Dead in Odisha, Hits Over a Crore Residents as Govt Makes Efforts to Restore Normalcy.

the monstrous spell of cyclone Fani. The mighty winds and incessant rain caused the death of 17,280 domestic animals.

As many as 3.32 lakh houses were damaged by the cyclone, which made a landfall in Puri district at 8 AM on May 3. The death toll of 32 remained low mainly because the state government had evacuated 13.88 lakh people from low-lying areas to shelter homes two days prior to the landfall, in what is being hailed as a historic evacuation exercise.



CM Naveen Patnaik announced a special relief package for the cyclone-hit people in Puri and Khorda. Each of the families, covered under the food

security scheme, will get 50 kg rice apart from polythene sheets and Rs 2,000. Other families affected by the cyclone will get a month's quota of rice, polythene sheets and Rs 1,000.

For houses which got fully damaged, an assistance of Rs 95,100 will be disbursed while Rs 52,000 will be doled out for partially damaged houses. The government will pay Rs 3,200 for houses that suffered minor damage, announced the CM.

According to a state government official, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to visit Odisha to review the situation. Modi spoke to Patnaik on Saturday and assured continuous support from the Centre for the rehabilitation work. The East Coast Railway (ECoR) partially resumed operations on the Howrah-Chennai route on Sunday.

"Barring the Bhubaneswar-Tirupati Express and the Visakhapatnam Intercity Express, all trains originating from the state capital, including the Bhubaneswar-New Delhi Rajdhani Express, will be running normally from Sunday," an ECoR official said.

Bhubaneswar: The death toll in Cyclone Fani rose to 32 on Sunday even as the state government mounted massive restoration exercises with the help of several rescue and reconstruction organisations.

Two days after the "extremely severe" storm that barrelled through coastal Odisha, causing widespread destruction and leaving hundreds grappling with water shortage and power cuts, pictures of the extensive devastation came to light.

At least 1.5 crore people have been affected by the cyclone, which passed through the state with wind speeds ranging between 200 and 240 kmph.

Of the 32 deaths, 20 took place in Puri — the worst hit among all the districts, followed by Khorda. Unofficial figures of the death toll across Odisha remained as high as 40.

According to the office of the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) of the state, 145 blocks were affected in 11 districts and areas close to the Bay of Bengal coast. As many as 15,846 villages and 773 wards in 51 urban areas came under

# 5 Prayers We Must Pray This Election

The 17th Lok Sabha elections are here. This election will determine what course the nation will take in the next five years. The country has been through hell in the past five years. Lynchings in the name of cow protection, demonetisation, GST, religious tensions, tanking of the GDP growth, gagging of all institutions and the rise of aggressive Hindutva politics have seen minorities being terrorised, the economy getting battered, justice being denied and the nation becoming a laughing stock in the international arena. Rather than deliver on its promises, the incumbent government has resorted to spin politics, propaganda and blaming Nehru for things he did not even live to see, leave alone execute.

However, as mature Christians we have a spiritual mandate too – to pray and let God shape the destiny of the people of the nation and the world at large. **1.** Pray for the peaceful conduct of Lok Sabha elections in April and May. In this elections, 900 million people have so far registered. May there be no violence or bloodshed in the country. May wisdom prevail upon people of all states irrespective of their religious and political leanings to elect a government that is pro-poor, works for development, shuns corruption at all levels and ensures the safety of the minorities.

2. Pray for righteous men and women who are Godfearing to be at the helm of the Election Commission, the state election commission offices and police departments in every state and every district and every village to check malpractice during campaigning, polling and counting of votes. Let this election not be a farce or an insult to the people of the nation.

**3.** Pray that the people of the nation primarily take into account four factors – social, political, local and livelihood issues – while exercising their mandate for the local MP or MLA (in states where byelections or assembly polls are due). Pray that God helps people rise above casteist considerations to vote a government that takes the country forward, not backward. As Christians, we need to remember what happened to our churches, pastors, evangelists, missionaries, NGOs and other minorities in the past five years and vote responsibly.

4. Over 15 million first-time voters are expected to press the EVM button in this election. Pray that these young voters are guided to vote for the right parties in all earnest by their parents and elders in their families. Where right guidance is not available, pray that these voters will be able to make up their minds in favor of candidates who are honest in their conduct and earnest in their desire to serve the people. May all candidates who are corrupt, casteist and have criminal and fundamentalist backgrounds be roundly defeated.

**5.** Social media apps and websites will play a major role in swinging votes. All parties are spending big on social media campaigns. Pray that the Election Commission is able to clamp down heavily on political parties that incite violence in the run-up to the elections through rumors and propaganda. May the people, especially the youth of the nation, also be wise in their political choices.

# 12 things you may not know about Graham Staines, Missionary to India who was Burnt Alive.

Graham Staines was an Australia missionary who served in India. His two children and he were brutally burned alive.

1. An ordinary day conducting a 'Jungle camp' for Indian tribals turned out to be his day of martyrdom. Graham Staines (58) was burnt alive in his old four-wheel drive Willy's station, along with his two sons, Phillip (10)and Timothy(7) on January 23, 1999. They were sleeping in the van on that night, in the wilderness of Manoharpur village, where about 150 Santhali tribal families lived



2.The doors of the residents were locked from the outside, ensuring that no one was able to come out and rescue Graham Staines and his two sons.



3. The murder was masterminded by Dara Singh, a man who was involved in Hindutva. He was anti -Christian.





4. Born in Brisbane, in the year 1941,he came to India in the year 1965, to meet his pen-pal SantanuSatpaty of Baripada, Orissa. He made India his home. Santanu and he shared the same birthday.

5. Graham Staines , fresh out of school, fell in love with the Mayurbhanj Leprosy home and dedicated his life to serving lepers in the home, on the outskirts of Baripada. This was started in 1896 by the Evangelical Missionary Society. Graham was the superintendent-cumsecretary-cum-treasurer of the Evangelical Missionary Society, and ran the home.

6. Graham Staines met Gladys in 1981, while working with leprosy patients. They married in 1983 and served together in the Mayurbanj leprosy mission. Gladys is a trained nurse.



7. Leprosy was considered a dreadful disease and lepers were treated as social outcasts. Graham Staines empowered them to live with dignity and respect. He provided them vocational skills so they could earn a living.

8. Graham Staines was fluent in Oriya and Santhali, the two local languages in the region. He took the gospel to the tribal people. He assisted in translating a part of the Bible into the Ho language, including proof reading the entire New Testament manuscript.



9.Graham used to conduct jungle camps to instruct tribals on a range of subjects from public health to the Bible.

10. Graham Staines and his wife, worked tirelessly caring for burn victims, when a major fire broke out in Baripada, in 1997, in which over 200 died, and 500 were injured, most of them critically. They earned the love of the localites.

11. Graham Staines had been elected presidentdesignate of the local Rotary chapter for 2001, Staines played a key role in the Pulse Polio immunisation drive.



12 Graham Staines Memorial Hospital was founded and built in the year 2004 in memory of him. It is a 15 bedded Charitable Hospital, situated in the heart of Baripada. Unfortunately, due to a standoff with the state government the Hospital is not functioning, since There is still a strong anti-Christian governance in Orissa.



13 Till today the people amongst whom he served, weep in his memory. They remember his death anniversary every year. His legacy lives on.

6 Questions with Sri Lankan Christians following the Easter Bombing Attacks



In the wake of the Easter bombings in Sri Lanka that killed more than 350 people, Christian Headlines reached out to persecution watchdog Open Doors who has a team on the ground to ask them about the state of Christianity on the South Asian Island.



# 1. WHAT IS A TYPICAL EASTER SUNDAY LIKE IN THE COUNTRY?

Easter Sunday is one of the highest attended Sundays and one of the most celebrated holy days for Christians in this region. They observe Lent, the time period leading up to Easter, as a season to reflect on their relationship with God. Easter is the celebratory end to this season that culminates in remembering the resurrection.

# 2. WHAT IS IT TYPICALLY LIKE FOR CHRISTIANS IN SRI LANKA? WHAT ABOUT MISSIONARIES?

Sri Lanka is #46 on the Open Doors World Watch List—a comprehensive ranking of the most difficult places in the world to be a Christian. This means it is not one of the ten or twenty most hostile countries, where this sort of violence would be expected. But life for Christians can still be challenging there.

Local Christian leaders and our staff have reported they face tensions between some adherents of the majority religion, Buddhism, and another minority group, Muslims. (Christians in Sri Lanka are the smallest religion in the country, making up just 1.9 million of the 21-million-person population.)

Typically, these believers are subject to harassment, discrimination, or exclusion from their families and communities. Sometimes they are pressured to return to the native Buddhist faith.

Open Doors has seen Christian churches attacked by its neighbors and mom protests outside of churches. For example, in September of 2018, a group of 100 people interrupted the worship service at a church at Beliatta. They damaged a window and vehicles in the parking lot, they took down crosses, and they threatened to kill the pastor. Still, with routine harassment and violence going on, we had no reason to expect the scale of attack that unfolded in Sri Lanka a few days ago. The severity and coordination seen in this attack is truly unprecedented in this part of the world.



3. WHAT HAS THE ENVIRONMENT BEEN LIKE IN SRI LANKA SINCE THE ATTACKS?

From Sunil, an Open Doors team member in Sri Lanka: "I was at church when my daughter came in and informed me that my brother-in-law, who happened to be in Batticaloa, called to say a bomb had gone off at Zion Church there. I was shocked and heart broken. Couldn't believe what I was hearing. I stopped what I was doing and prayed for everyone there. This was the reaction among Christians around the country as well, as they learned of the other bombings. Many congregations interrupted Easter services to pray for those affected."

"The Christian community here is shocked. The question everyone is asking is, 'Why did this happen?' People were confused and didn't understand why churches were being targeted. They are gathering in prayer and encouraging their people not to retaliate and further inflame any hostilities. And some are already telling us they intend to go back to church on Sunday if the government will allow it."

### The Latest from Israel: Why Did Jesus Have to Die for Us?

Benjamin Netanyahu seems to be in position to win a fourth consecutive term as <u>prime minister of Israel</u>.

As of this morning, 97 percent of the votes have been counted in Israel's parliamentarian election. As I explained yesterday, <u>no party has ever won a sixty-onevote majority in the Knesset</u> (their Parliament). The party leader who seems most likely to form a majority coalition with other parties will be given an opportunity to do so.

So far, that leader appears to be Mr. Netanyahu.

"I KNOW THAT MY REDEEMER LIVES"

Yesterday we asked the question: '<u>Why dont the Jews</u> accept Jesus as their <u>Messiah?</u> There's a related question that is especially relevant to American culture as well.

Job was confident: "I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God" (Job 19:25–26).

While life after death is affirmed in the Old Testament (cf. <u>Isaiah 26:19</u>), Judaism has evolved in its beliefs about the afterlife across the centuries since.

<u>Rabbi Evan Moffic</u> writes: "Heaven has [an] open door policy: Heaven is not a gated community. The righteous of any people and any faith have a place in it. Our actions, not our specific beliefs, determine our fate. No concept of Hell exists in Judaism."

<u>Rabbi Tzvi Freeman</u> believes that "in the afterlife, the soul is liberated from the body and returns closer to her source than ever before." During this passage, "the good deeds and wisdom the soul has gained on her mission below serve as a protection for her journey upwards." Then, "at the final resolution, all souls will return to physical bodies in this world."

Writing for Haaretz, <u>Elon Gilad</u> notes that "even today, Jews believe in different, often irreconcilable, theories of what life after death is like." For instance, according to the Talmud (Eruvin 19b), most people go to a place where their sins are purged, then they are ushered by Abraham into heaven.

Additionally, some Jews do not believe in an afterlife at all. They claim that we live on through our influence in the world and in the memories of those who knew us.

# IS MOTHER TERESA IN HEAVEN?

To summarize: Some Jews believe that we simply cease to exist at death. Others believe that the "righteous" go to heaven, either because they are considered sufficiently moral or because they pass through a purgatory-type cleansing process.

Either way, Jews are confident that there is no hell to fear and no atonement necessary.

This belief helps explain why Jews do not accept Jesus as their Messiah. As we noted yesterday, <u>they are</u> <u>expecting a Messiah who will be a conquering hero</u> <u>rather than a suffering servant</u>. As we have seen today, they also reject the need for Jesus' death on the cross. I make this point not just with regard to Judaism, but also because many Americans feel the same way.

Reportedly, <u>77 percent of people with no religious</u> affiliation are confident they are good enough to go to heaven. In a poll taken a few months before Mother Teresa died, 79 percent of Americans surveyed thought she would go to heaven. However, <u>87 percent were confidentthey would go there</u>.

Apparently, most Americans believe they do not need to trust in Jesus' atonement for our sins to go to heaven. What can we say to them?

# WHAT JESUS COULD DO THAT BUDDHA COULD NOT

We know that "God is love" (<u>1 John 4:8</u>). Why, then, doesn't he forgive our sins just because he loves us? Why did he send Jesus to die for us?

God is also "holy, holy, holy" (Isaiah 6:3; Revelation 4:8). His heaven is therefore perfect, a place where "death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4).

For us to be granted entrance into God's perfect presence, our sins must first be removed. The debt we owe for them must be paid.

What is this debt?

"The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23; cf. Ezekiel 18:20). This is because death separates us from the holy God who is the only source of eternal life. It's like cutting off a flower to place in a vase. It may look healthy, but it is dying and its appeal will soon fade.

Only one person in all of human history has lived a sinless life. Not Muhammad, or Confucius, or Buddha, or anyone else. Only Jesus

Sin leads to death. This is why the payment for sin must be death. It's why sinners are separated from God for all eternity in hell, a place of living death.

And it's why we cannot pay this debt for each other. Because I have committed sins, I cannot die for yours. It's as if I owe the hundred dollars in my pocket to the bank; I cannot use it to pay your debt and mine.

The only person who could pay the debt of our sins would be someone who never committed sins of his own. And only one person in all of human history has lived a sinless life. Not Muhammad, or Confucius, or Buddha, or anyone else. Only Jesus (<u>Hebrews 4:15</u>).

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


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
