Capture the Vision for Souls

What is Worship? Randall McElwain



orship has become a battlefield in many churches today. Sadly, worshipof "one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (Eph 4:6)has become something that divides rather than unifying the church.

With all ourattentionto worship styles, we can fail to ask the deeper question, "What is worship?" Is worship simply a twenty-minute music segment? Is it an emotional catharsis created as we sway to the rhythm of a praise band?

The Bible shows that true worship is far more than a scheduled service or an emotional experience. One of my favorite definitions of worship comes from Warren Wiersbe: "Worship is the response of all that we are to all that God is." True worship affects all of life.

There are several words associated with worship in Scripture. These words show what it means to worship "in spirit and in truth."

1) Worship is reverent submission to God

The word most often translated "worship" in the Bible carries the idea of "falling down" before God. In worship, we bow in reverent submission to God. We see this word in Revelation when John saw the worship in heaven:

The twenty-four elders fall down before him who is seated on the throne and worship him who lives forever and ever. They cast their crowns before the throne, saying, "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you *created all things, and by your will they existed and were created*" (Rev 4:10-11).

Our modern word worship comes from an Old English word, "worthship." To offer "worthship" meant to recognize and honor a person's worthy. This is what it means to worship God – to give Him the honor of which He is truly worthy. In true worship we bow our hearts in humble submission to an all-powerful God.

2) Worship is obedient service to God

Another New Testament word shows our obedient service to God. Paul used this word when he wrote:

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship(Rom 12:1).

A holy God requires obedient service by a holy people. This word shows that worship is more than what happens on Sunday in a church building. Worship does not end when the public meeting ends; true worship affects all areas of our life.

3) Worship is joyful celebration of God

The word "praise" is used more than 130 times in the book of Psalms to refer to worship. Much of today's joyful praise and worship music shows that worship should celebrate God.

We must never lose our reverence for God, but we should never lose our joy. We do not worship an austere and distant God. We worship a good God

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he bow and arrow has been an indispensable weapon of warfare used by both ancient and modern civilizations. It continues to live on in the well contested Olympic sport of archery. True to its name, the imagery that an arrow brings to the human mind is quite telling – sharp and piercing, and easy to picturize. Hence, it is not surprising that our Heavenly Father communicates to us with figurative references to arrowsall throughout the Bible, to perhaps drive home His point better!(Jeremiah 9:8, Ezekiel 5:16, Psalm 127:4, Ephesians 6:16) Let's recall the key purpose and characteristic of an arrow. Its key purpose is to precisely strikeone and only onetarget at a time. Its key characteristic is the ability to pierce deeply. In warfare and hunting, the arrow tip is intentionally sharpened and poisoned to ensure fatalwounding of the target. True; an archer is behind the scenes aiming the arrow towards the target and releasing it skillfully. Let's take the archer out of the picture. If an arrow were to have a mind of its own, it would need to channel all its energy into executing its single mission. The targeted flight calls for an undivided focus; the arrow cannot afford to see anything but the target. Instead, what ifan arrow decides to gaze all around, blurring its focus? What if the arrowfeels disheartened about its microcosmic target area and dwells upon the vast cosmos around, which it cannot cover, , thus doubting the significance of its mission? What if the arrow compares itself with other arrows shooting by, some of which might appear mightier, faster, or prettier?

The hard reality is that no matter how hard the arrow tries it can never successfully take over its neighbour's path or target. In every failed such attempt, our protagonist would have missed its own mark as well as messed another's.

Isaiah 49:2 says that we are polished arrows concealed in the Lord's quiver. Just like the physical arrow, every one of us in the Lord Jesus Christis a powerful arrow, meant to fulfil a uniqueobjective at a given time. Not only that, the archer who is carrying us, is none other the Lord Himself. We only need to partner with our Father, yield to Him, and see the very same thing He sees as the target. In doing so, absolute and sure victory is inevitable.

It does not matter whether a believer is in an influential position or not, in terms of being in the public eye. Every believer is equally precious to the Lord. He does not show favouritism (Deuteronomy 10:17, Romans 2:11). 1 Corinthians 12:12-17 talks of us being different parts of one body. Every part, including seemingly insignificant ones, has its dedicated function to keep the body whole and perfect. The countable few souls in a person's reach might be the specific targets assigned to them, whom no public evangelist might have been able to touch. There could be a thousand people around usout of our reach; there could be a dozen giftings in other believers around us, which we long for; but that should not be a reason for us to lack excitement about the task on our plate. Whatever we do, we are supposed to do wholeheartedly as if we were doing unto the Lord Himself

(Colossians 3:23) – anexhortation that levels the playing field.

SPECIAL-NEEDS SIBLINGS EXPERIENCE QUESTIONS& GRIEF SEASONS TOO

ust like their parents, it is common for special-needs siblings to experience seasons of grief associated with the disabilities affecting their family. Unfortunately, the internal struggles of children in a special needs family can be inadvertently overlooked by stretched parents or naïve mentors and church leaders. Sometimes parents simply feel illequipped to handle their children's questions, anger or sadness. Nonetheless, these young people need freedom to wrestle with questions and explore their sorrow where they can receive rich amounts of empathy, ample space to process their feelings and opportunities to sift their perspectives through biblical principles.

Siblings in a family affected by disability need information and want to make sense of their situation. Their questions, feelings and perspectives typically change through different developmental stages of life. Here are some of the questions my own children were able to articulate—sometimes accompanied by significant emotion—as they were growing up in a special needs family:

childhood: Why can't I hold my baby sister?

adolescence: *Why does our family have to be so high-maintenance?*

adulthood: How do I stop feeling guilty when I get to go away and have a break (or a life beyond my family) but my parents get no relief from their caregiving responsibilities?

How parents, mentors, pastors and other

church leaders respond may be similar to how we have conversations with our young people about other tender issues like sex—with more complex and vulnerable layers of information as they mature.

Too often, children wonder about things silently or something limits their ability to articulate questions or concerns (e.g., age, emotional maturity, confusion or overwhelm, feeling unsafe to express deep thoughts and feelings without judgment). Children benefit from help exploring and articulating what is ambiguous or confusing to them, especially when they sense a freedom to do so where their emotions will be honored rather than edited.

So, what are some of the questions special-needs siblings wonder about?

CHILDHOOD

What's going on? When is my turn? Why do mom and dad (and maybe older siblings) seem worried/sad/stressed? Why is my sibling different? Am I good enough? Why do people look at him/her/us that way?

ADOLESCENCE

What do my friends think? Why did I get to be the healthy one? How can I get a break? Who am I apart from this unique (To be continued...)

Needless to say, Thad is doing okay. He is such an inspiration!





was unilateral: a promise that was not founded on any worthiness on the part of the beneficiaries. The offspring of Abraham/Isaac/Jacob – *the race that we know as the Jews* – would be born into benefits that were promised by God to their forebears. His blessing... and a land of their own, forever.

So what is it that makes Jews – with only two-tenths of one percent of the world population – win 23% of all Nobel Prizes? The fact that Jews are disproportionally successful in many fields of endeavor is undeniable. The statistics simply speak for themselves: Jews make up less than half of one percent of the world's population, but they consistently have made up more than 20% of the Forbes 400 list. But, it is not just about making money; 30% of Nobel Prize winners <u>in science</u> are Jewish. In virtually every industry successful Jews are disproportionally represented. Some attribute these anomalies to tradition or culture; could there be more to it?

In the financial world, "the Invisible Hand" is often referenced as the unseen force that moves and benefits free-market economies. Could there be an Invisible Hand that is the unseen force that controls people – as individuals, as groups – through the flow of history? Is the Chaos Theory behind what seems to be an out-of-control world with virulent viruses and plunging international markets, or is there an Almighty God who is, in fact, moving the players on the board in keeping with His intentions?

PREPARING FOR OLD AGE-ATTENDING

TO OUR PHYSICAL HEALTH

One major area that needs careful attention in the process of aging is physical health. A healthy lifestyle that includes balanced diet, exercise, and rest, along with routine medical checkups are necessary to keep ourselves healthy throughout life, especially in old age. But in spite of all that we do to keep ourselves in good physical shape, we do not have the absolute control over our health. Within a short span of time, our health status can significantly change. As discussed in the previous article, there are certain illnesses and health challenges that are particularly associated with aging such as cataracts, macular degeneration and glaucoma, hearing impairments, stroke, and heart attack. Some of these conditions are physically, mentally, and psychologically debilitating, and we may end up in conditions where someone else will have to make treatment decisions for us, and sometimes we would not have approved those types of medical interventions, if we had the power to choose them. For this reason, it is important that we think through those medical options while we are still in good cognitive faculty. I would like to introduce two helpful choices in this matter- The Living Will, and The Durable Power of Attorney.

The Living Will allows a competent individual to provide medical directives in advance, in an explicit manner, as how he or she must be treated in the event of an unanticipated medial situation when the person is legally incompetent to make an autonomous medical decision. Strokes and heart failures are good examples for these kinds of conditions. The Living Will facilitates physicians to make medical decisions that will honor the patient's wishes. Based on the directives in the Will, the physicians can now precede with the treatment options. In some situations, the decision would be not to proceed with aggressive treatments but to allow the person to die a natural death, because that is what the patient expressed in his or her Will.

The Durable Power of Attorney is another option opened for all, but especially for older adults. In this, an individual could prepare a legal document in advance where he or she could delegate someone to act on his or her behalf, should he or she becomes legally incompetent to act. This document allows a deputy to exercise control over an unforeseen situation where a medical decision will, have to be made, such as whether to continue or discontinue artificial feeding, or to withhold or to terminate mechanical life support.

It is prudent to have either a Living Will or a Durable Power of Attorney prepared ahead of time because these important health-care choices not only help us manage our lives more circumspectly, but also make it easier for our family members to handle medical emergencies that involve our lives.

Does My Child Need to be Healed? A Father's Reflections

... and a little child shall lead them. I S A I A H 1 1 : 6

Sitting at the dinner table one evening, my four-year-old son surprised us with a profound question about his older brother. "Daddy," Jaron said, "why did God make Caleb with special needs?" Gathering my thoughts, I responded, "What did you ask, Son?" Jaron repeated his question without hesitation, "Why did God make Caleb with special needs?"

Caleb, who was eight at the time, was born with a deletion on his number 2 chromosome, resulting in developmental disabilities, intellectual and physical delays, muscular dystrophy and autism. Caleb didn't walk until he was six years old, has challenging autistic characteristics, and has never spoken a word.

I was amazed that such a deep question was coming from my preschooler and paused, trying to find a way to express my thoughts on a level he could comprehend. Honestly, part of my own heart still struggles with the "why" of it all. I'm not sure any parent can fully satisfy this question, although many have found great comfort in the plans and purposes of God.

I turned to my wife Melissa, who had a look of expectation, wondering how I was going to answer Jaron. Finally, I broke the silence, and began explaining how Caleb was like any other boy except due to his "special needs" he had to interact differently. God had a plan when he created Caleb and wanted to use him to touch other peoples' lives. I told Jaron that one day when Caleb went to heaven he would be healed. He would run, talk and play like all the other children.

My answer seemed to appease our questioning theologian for a moment. Then he rolled his head around, looked up to the sky and asked, "Why doesn't God just heal him now?" Melissa's eyes were filling with tears (mine were wet, too). Such a simple follow-up question! With a complicated, some- times heartwrenching answer.

We told Jaron that it was not God's desire to heal his brother right now, but that God loved Caleb very much whether he could speak or walk or talk. All people are created in God's image and we bring him glory by being who he created us to be. I spoke of the gifts and abilities Caleb has and how he canhave a full life in spite of his disabilities. I also reassured Jaron that my answers may not make complete sense because sometimes we simply have to trust God even when we don't understand his ways. In short, I told him that Caleb did not need to be healed.

I wish I could say I had drawn such a simple conclusion shortly after Caleb's birth. Unfortunately, that was not the case. The first two years of Caleb's life were a huge struggle for me, and consequently us as a family. At that time I couldn't yet accept Caleb for who he was-I needed him to be healed. I ex- perienced anger, grief and depression over his condition. I desperately wanted him to be healed and felt my prayers fell silent at heaven's doors. My God seemed impotent as my world crumbled. My biblical theology and real-life experience were out of alignment. I labored to interpret Scripture out of my ex- perience, instead of allowing Scripture to interpret my experience. Let me explain.I had been impacted by a theology that erroneously emphasized God's will for all to be healed... 100 percent of the time! No exceptions! ! In fact, if there was a sickness, disability or ailment of some sort, it was due to a lack of faith on that person's part, or the work of Satan, or sin in one's life, or a combination of all three.

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
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

More than 2,200 language groups don't have access to The Bible. And we're not okay with that.

The senior class at Ethnos 360 Bible Institute has had the privilege to devote these past two years to studying The Word of God. As we contemplated the legacy we would leave the class, we were struck by the fact that there are countless millions of people who have no access to The Word of God in their language.

After much prayer, rounds of class voting, and an executive decision, we finally decided on a project to support. PROJECT: WABUKU was born on December 11,2019. Lisa Kappeler and her team has been working in Wabuku, Papua New Guinea pioneering the Uriay (pronounced OO-de-eye) Bible Translation diligently for decades amidst transition. She now has new co-workers who are beginning the language learning process in order to continue teaching the people the gospel. Our goal is \$10,000, which is more than any graduating class in Jackson has ever fund-raised, but we are well in our way. We would like to raise this so that Lisa and the team can continue to translate and teach with fewer financial worries. The New Testament is about 46% complete! It takes approximately four hours of work and \$35 dollars to translate a single verse.\$10,000 would enable about 285 Bible verses to be translated.

We are so thankful for the opportunity to partner with our brothers and sisters on the other side of the globe, and with you all here in The States. It is so encouraging to know that our God is more than able to use jars of clay from all over the world to complete His mission!

Break the yolk.... Kalpana Daniel



he new year is replete with memories of the past year, and overflowing with resolutions on how to better our lives. There is an echo of health and fitness everywhere I turn. I feel the pressure to tone it down too, else I may not fit in. And amidst these fancy articles and advertisements, I chance upon a small testimony by Mother Teresa. She talks about a starving child whom she picked up from a street in Calcutta. By the look in her eyes, Mother understood that this child was hungry and she offered her a loaf of bread. However, she ate this loaf very slowly, crumb by crumb. When Mother asked her the reason, she replied, "I am afraid to eat faster. When I finish this piece, soon I will be hungry again." I couldn't contain my tears. Ridden with guilt, I lashed out my door and handed over some fruits and food packets to the workers in my apartment. Couple of days passed, and that guilt lessened. Then I came across this passage from Isaiah 58 and Mathew 25, overlaid with God's anger to our boastful ideas of fasting and prayer. It makes us pause and ponder on the reasons of what the Bible calls justice.

Let us for a moment consider this-how far did God of the Bible go to identify with the poor? He was the son of a carpenter basically with no social standing and belonging to the poorest of the poor. He was homeless and died oppressed. Lynched, beaten, unrepresented, the God of the Bible chose to become a victim of an unjust system of this world. That's how far!

We often comment on the injustices of this world. If there is a God, how can He can allow these things to happen? Why doesn't He do something about it? Well, He did. He died on the Cross-the very epitome of injustice. And so, He alone understands our suffering. Guilt can only produce religious acts as long as it lasts. Verse 6 literally means that if our children have better resources than the world around them, then we are a part of that unjust system. It is not calling me to just loosen the yolk to a certain extent, as much as possible; it calls me to break it. It is my responsibility as a christian to share what I have with all those who are deprived. I may fast and pray for hours, worship and do all that makes me feel righteous, yet God says, in Matthew 25:40 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.' He asked us to serve the poor if we love Him.

Biblical justice is not the same as social justice. It points us to interdependence. Our resources are not just ours, it must be shared with everyone in need. Plunge and donate everything you have if you really love Him as your Lord. This new year, take the lens of biblical justice and look at what was paid for you as a ransom. He shed the last drop His precious blood to reunite us to the fabric of the heavenly realms. That's what it calls for. Go down to those places where the yolk is heavy and the need is surmounting. Give everything you have, your time, your money, our resources, your physical efforts, everything and then as Verse 14 says,

'then you will find your joy in the Lord,

and I will cause you to ride in triumph on the heights of the land

and to feast on the inheritance of your father Jacob."

May we learn to love Him with all our heart, soul, and mind as the days unfold. God bless you all!
