To maintain a healthy atmosphere as well as to teach and encourage our students to be active and independent, we recently started a nursery project which will help our students and residents at Justin's Home. This fun and interesting project include a variety of plants that are sold at reasonable prices at our Sathyam Publications headquarters in Thiruvalla. Funds from the sale of these plants will help in meeting the expenses and maintenance of Justin's Home. In addition, this new venture is also an educational experience for the special needs students by emphasizing the importance and need for taking care of our environment and planting more trees.



Justin's Home, a School for the Differently Aabled was inaugurated on Feb. 20, 2012, at Kaviyoor, Thiruvalla. We provide services to children suffering from mental retardation, autism, Down's syndrome, cerebral palsy, hydrocephalus, and learning disabilities. We began with 14 children and today 43 children attend daily. In addition, 130 children attend on an occasional basis for whom we provide shelter, food, care, education, speech therapy, and physiotherapy. We believe that each child is unique with individual talents, interests, and abilities. By offering the gift

of education and a new life to these children, we believe they hold a brighter future for themselves, their village, our country, and the world. It is only due to the patronage of people like you that we have managed to work towards achieving our mission of caring for more children.
